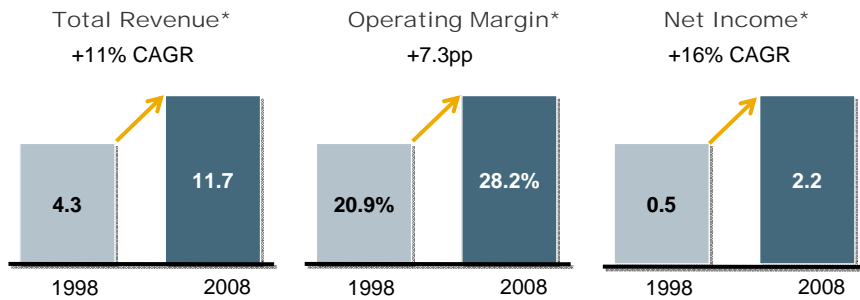

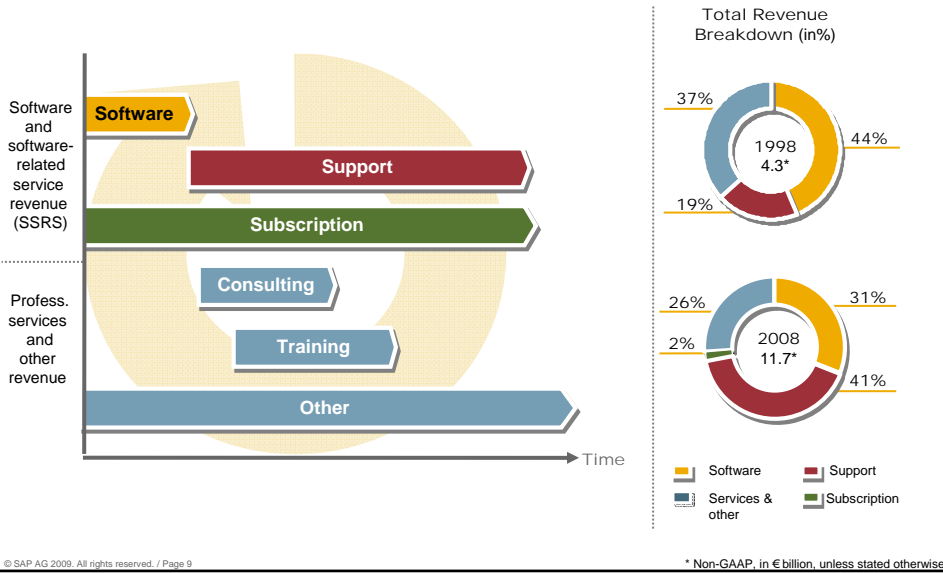

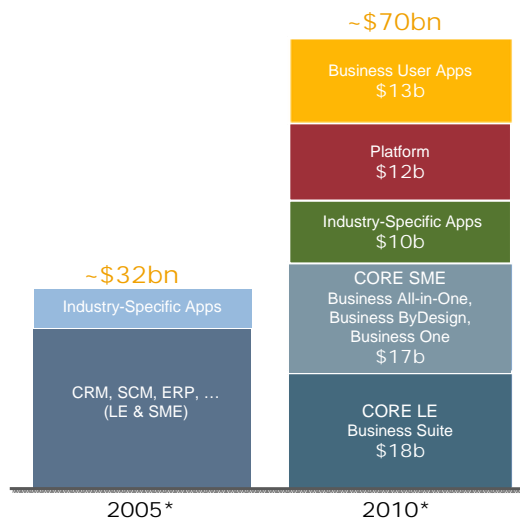

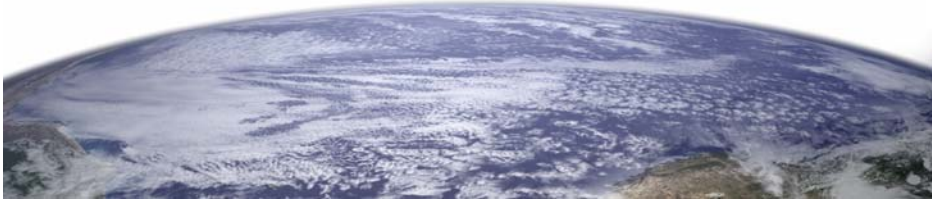

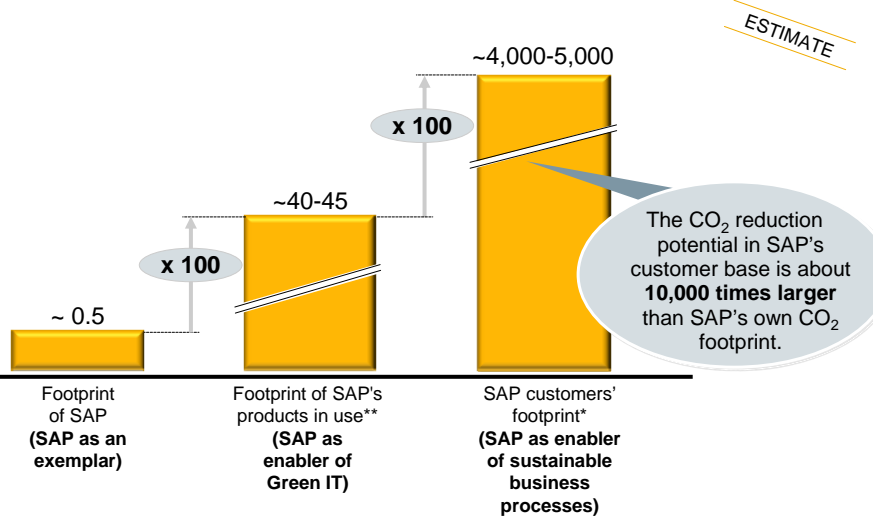

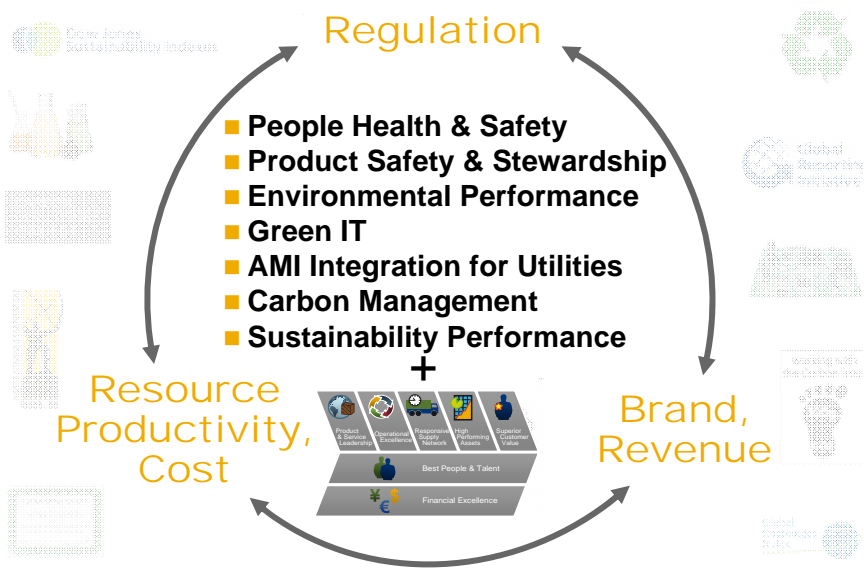

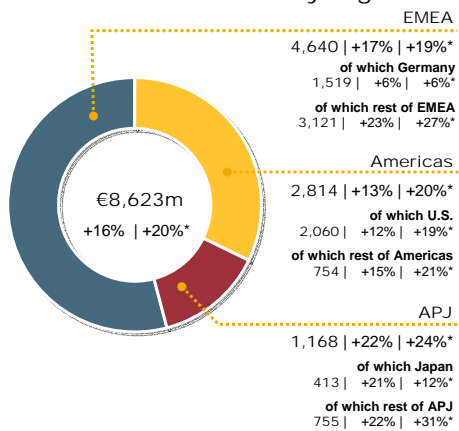
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Non-GAAP Revenue Breakdown by Region** Full-Year 2008

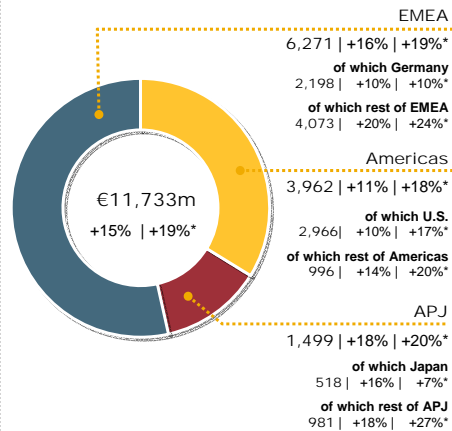
